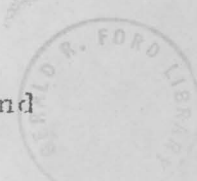

GREEK FOREIGN MINISTER: The Greek foreign minister is here at the invitation of the U.S. There will probably be a readout after the meeting. The reason for the meeting is for renegotiation for American bases. ADDITIONAL SCHEDULE ITEMS: The President will be meeting with a group of Middle East Christians and Moslems (American). This meeting is at their request to discuss issues of mutual concern, among the others, the subject of Lebanon will be addressed. PANAMA CANAL: The negotiations are an affirmative action by the U.S. growing out of the 1964 situation there. Also, the other countries of Latin America feel that there is a need for a change (especially the Treaty of 1903), another reason to maintain negotiations. RN went on to say that there has been a heavy load of rhetoric emptied into this issue. On canal sovereignty, there is not a clear cut legal agreement on sovereignty in the canal zone. It is a complex legal matter and RN indicated that he is not qualified to handle it. As to when the negotiations will end, it is not possible to determine.



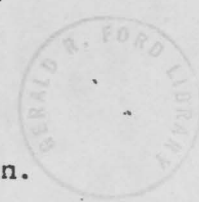
