Should you desire to see the State Department suggested list, please inform my office and as soon as it is received, I will forward a copy to you.

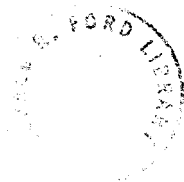

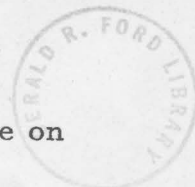
