You will sign the National Mass Transportation Assistance Act of 1974 at 10:15 a.m. in the East Room before a large group of approximately 125 members of Congress (including the attendance at your 9:15 a.m. Leadership Meeting), Governors, Mayors, Department officials, transportation industry representatives and representatives of the National Association of Counties. Leadership Meeting terminates and the Leaders are escorted over to the East Room and seated in the first two rows stage left and stage right. You return to the Oval Office.

10:15 a.m.

Depart Oval Office for the East Room.

You proceed directly to the platform along the East wall to the podium stage right to deliver remarks.
