THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate Victor Gilinsky, of Santa Monica, California, to be a Member of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission for a term of four years. The Commission was established by Public Law 93-438 of November 11, 1974 which also provided for the abolishment of the Atomic Energy Commission.

Mr. Gilinsky is the head of the Physical Science Department of the Rand Corporation. He has also served as a consultant to the Atomic Energy Commission since 1973. From 1971 to 1973 he has been with the Atomic Energy Commission as a Special Assistant to the Director of Regulation and later as Assistant Director for Policy and Program Review, Office of Planning and Analysis. He was project leader, International Aspects of Nuclear Energy, for the Rand Corporation from 1969 to 1971. In 1961 he joined the Rand Corporation as a Physicist, serving until 1971.

He was born on May 28, 1934, in Warsaw, Poland. He received his B.A. degree from Cornell University in 1956 and his Ph.D. from the California Institute of Technology in 1961.

He is married to the former Magdalena Maria Nowacka and they have two children. They reside in Santa Monica, California.
