The President today announced his intention to nominate Robert J. Corber, of Arlington, Virginia, to be an Interstate Commerce Commissioner for the remainder of a term expiring December 31, 1976. He will succeed W. Donald Brewer who resigned effective June 30, 1974.

Since 1951, he has been associated with the law firm of Steptoe and Johnson. He was State Chairman of the Republican Party from 1964 to 1968 in the State of Virginia.

Mr. Corber was born on June 29, 1926 in Topeka, Kansas. He received his B.S. degree from the University of Kansas in 1946 and his J. D. degree from Washburn University in 1950. He completed course work for a degree of Doctor of Juridical Science in 1951 at the University of Michigan. He served in the United States Navy from 1944 to 1947.

He is married and has four children. They reside in Arlington, Virginia.
