The President today announced the appointment of four persons to be members of the National Advisory Council on Supplementary Centers and Services for a term of three years. They are:

Arthur Ballantine, of Durango, Colorado, Editor and Publisher, Durango Herald, Durango, Colorado. This is a reappointment.

Inez Clark Eddings, Columbia, South Carolina, retired educator, Columbia, South Carolina. This is a reappointment.

Elise Rosenbaum Lestin, of Rochester, New York, Director of Elementary and Middle School Curriculum, Penfield Central Schools, Penfield, New York. This is a reappointment.

Arnold L. Norskov, of Albion, Nebraska, Owner-Operator, grain and purebred livestock farm, Albion, Nebraska. This is a reappointment.

The National Advisory Council on Supplementary Centers and Services was established by Public Law 90-247 of January 2, 1968, and consists of 12 members appointed by the President for terms of three years. The Council evaluates the supplementary education programs supported by Title III of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965. The act authorizes grants to the States for their use in the development of innovative educational projects to supplement the facilities and resources of local school districts.
