I ask the Congress to consider a proposed appropriation language change for the fiscal year 1975 which would increase by \$96,106,000 the limitation on the aggregate amount of purchase contracts used to finance building construction administered by the General Services Administration.

Sir:

I have the honor to submit for your consideration a proposed appropriation language change for fiscal year 1975 which would increase a limitation not affecting budget authority. The details are as follows:

TREASURY, POSTAL SERVICE, AND GENERAL
GOVERNMENT APPROPRIATION ACT, 1975

TITLE V - GENERAL PROVISIONS

The limitation on the aggregate amount of purchase contracts pursuant to section 5 of the Public Buildings Amendments of 1972 (Public Law 92-313) contained in section 507 is increased to \$396,106,000.

This increase in limitation is necessary to provide funding under purchase contract authority for a Social Security building to be constructed by the General Services Administration in Baltimore, Maryland.

I have carefully reviewed this proposed appropriation language change and am satisfied that it is necessary at this time. I recommend, therefore, that this proposal be transmitted to the Congress.
