NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President has accepted with personal appreciation the resignation of John T. Dunlop as Chairman of the National Commission on Productivity and Work Quality, effective at the time of his swearing in as Secretary of Labor. Dr. Dunlop was appointed to the Commission on December 30, 1974. He will continue to remain as a member of the Commission and its Executive Committee.

The President has also appointed Vice President Nelson Rockefeller as Chairman of the National Commission on Work Productivity to succeed Dr. Dunlop.

The National Commission on Productivity and Work Quality shall advise the Congress and the President with respect to Government policy affecting productivity and quality of work, and requires the Commission to report annually on its activities both to the Congress and the President.

The Commission was originally established in 1970 and acquired its present name and charter in Public Law 93-311 of June 8, 1974.
