NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President today announced the reappointment of two persons as members of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation for terms expiring February 28, 1980. They are:

Bert M. Fireman, of Tempe, Arizona, Curator, Arizona Collection, Executive Vice President of the Arizona Historical Foundation, and Lecturer, Department of History, Arizona State University, Tempe, Arizona. He was appointed on June 16, 1971 for a term which expired on February 28, 1975.

David K. Wilson, of Nashville, Tennessee, President, Cherokee Equity Corporation, Nashville, Tennessee. He was appointed on September 14, 1970, for a term which expired on February 28, 1975.

The membership of the Council consists of the Secretaries of the Interior, Housing and Urban Development, Commerce, Treasury, Agriculture, Transportation, The Attorney General, Administrator of General Services, Chairman of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, Secretary of the Smithsonian Institution, and ten members appointed by the President. The Director of the National Park Service serves as the Executive Director of the Council.

The Council was established by Public Law 89-665 of October 15, 1966 for the purpose of advising the President and the Congress on historic preservation matters, encouraging public participation, and to recommend legislative and administrative measures.
