THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate Lawrence S. Eagleburger, of Arlington, Virginia, to be Deputy Under Secretary of State. He will succeed L. Dean Brown who has resigned.

Mr. Eagleburger is presently Executive Assistant to the Secretary of State and Acting Deputy Under Secretary of State for Management. He has been Executive Assistant to the Secretary of State since 1973. He was Deputy Assistant Secretary, International Security Affairs, Department of Defense from 1971 to 1973. In 1969 he went to Brussels to serve as a Political Counselor to the United States North Atlantic Treaty Organization until 1971. From January to July, 1969, he was Executive Assistant to Dr. Kissinger on the National Security Council.

Mr. Eagleburger joined the Department of State in 1957 as an Economic Officer in Tegucigalpa, Honduras. He served successively in the State Department as an Intelligence Research Specialist; Economic Officer in Belgrade, Yugoslavia; Foreign Affairs Officer, and later joined the National Security Council Staff, serving until 1967. He became Special Assistant to the Under Secretary of State in 1967, serving until 1968.

Mr. Eagleburger was born on August 1, 1930, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He received his B.S. degree in 1952 and his M.S. degree in 1957 from the University of Wisconsin. He served in the United States Army from 1953 to 1955.

Mr. Eagleburger is married to the former Marlene Heinemann and they have three children.
