NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President today announced his intention to nominate W. Laird Stabler, Jr., of Delaware, to be United States Attorney for the District of Delaware for a term of four years. He will succeed Ralph F. Keil who resigned effective April 1, 1975.

Mr. Stabler was a Representative for the 13th District of Delaware from 1967 to 1970 and served as Attorney General for Delaware from 1971 until 1975.
