NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President has designated five persons as his Representatives to the United States Delegation to the commemorative ceremonies marking the 30th anniversary of the restoration of peace in Europe. The members of the Delegation are:

John S. D. Eisenhower, of Phoenixville, Pennsylvania, former Ambassador to Brussels.

General Lyman Lemnitzer, United States Army (retired), of Washington, D.C., former Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff from 1960 to 1962; former Supreme Allied Commander in Europe from 1963 to 1969.

General Alfred M. Gruenther, United States Army (retired), former Supreme Allied Commander in Europe from 1953 to 1956.

Mrs. Llewellyn Thompson, of Washington, D.C., wife of the former Ambassador to the Soviet Union.

Mrs. Charles Bohlen, of Washington, D.C., wife of the former Ambassador to the Soviet Union.

The President also designated on April 28, 1975, W. Averill Harriman of Washington, D.C. as his personal Representative of the delegation.

The ceremonies will be held in Moscow on May 8, 1975.
