Lee M. Howard, M. D., Director, Office of Health, Bureau of Technical Assistance, Agency for International Development.

David J. Sencer, M. D., Director, Center for Disease Control, Department of Health, Education and Welfare Atlanta, Georgia.

The Assembly is composed of delegates representing all 141 Member States. It meets annually to consider policy, program and budget matters relating to the Organization, and to review past activities of the Organization.

The United States delegation will also include four Congressional Advisers, one Senior Adviser and five Advisers.
