The President today announced his intention to nominate Michael M. Uhlmann, of Annandale, Virginia, to be Assistant Attorney General, Office of Legislative Affairs. He will succeed W. Vincent Rakestraw who resigned effective February 1, 1975.

Since 1974, Mr. Uhlmann has been Assistant General Counsel for the Federal Trade Commission. He served from 1971 to 1974 as Legislative Assistant and Legislative Counsel to Senator Buckley of New York. From 1970 to 1971 he was Minority Staff Director for the Senate Select Committee on Equal Education Opportunity. He was an Instructor and Lecturer for California State College and Claremont Men's College from 1968 to 1970.

Mr. Uhlmann was born on December 29, 1939, in Washington, D. C. He received his B.A. degree from Yale University in 1962 and his LL.B. degree from the University of Virginia Law School in 1966. He also did additional graduate work at Claremont College Graduate School.

Mr. Uhlmann is married to the former Nancy Elizabeth Kowal and they have four children.
