THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today declared a major disaster for the State of North Dakota as a result of flooding from rains and snowmelt, beginning about April 10, which caused extensive public and private property damage. The President's action will permit the use of Federal funds in relief and recovery efforts in designated areas of the State.

Federal assistance from the President's Disaster Relief Fund will consist of disaster unemployment assistance payments to those who lost their jobs as a result of the storms, debris removal, and the repair or restoration of damaged or destroyed streets, roads, bridges, sewer and water systems, and public utilities. Emergency loan assistance will be made available by the Farmers Home Administration.

Federal relief activities in North Dakota will be coordinated by the Federal Disaster Assistance Administration, Department of Housing and Urban Development, under the direction of Administrator Thomas P. Dunne. Mr. Dunne will designate the specific areas within the State eligible for Federal assistance, based upon Federal and State damage assessments.

Donald G. Eddy, Regional Director of the Federal Disaster Assistance Administration, HUD Region VIII, will be designated as the Federal Coordinating Officer to work with the State in providing Federal disaster assistance under the Disaster Relief Act of 1974, Public Law 93-288.
