The President today announced the appointment of five persons as members of the National Advisory Council on Education Professions Development for a term expiring April 26, 1978. They are:

Manera A. Constantine, of Wilmington, Delaware, Program Manager, Project 70001. She succeeds Arnulfo L. Oliveira whose term has expired.

Carol Doherty, of Taunton, Massachusetts, Elementary Guidance Counselor, Taunton, Massachusetts. She succeeds Thomas R. Hills, whose term has expired.

Archie R. Dykes, of Lawrence, Kansas, Chancellor, University of Kansas. He succeeds Lyle E. Anderson, Jr., whose term has expired.

Jeanne Noble, of New York, New York, Associate Professor, School of Education, Brooklyn College, City College of New York. She succeeds Julia M. Jacobsen whose term has expired.

William R. Wood, of Fairbanks, Alaska, President Emeritus, University of Alaska. He succeeds Waldo Banks, Sr. whose term has expired.

The President also announced the designation of Walter Tice to serve as Chairman. He succeeds Lyle E. Anderson whose term has expired.

The Council consists of 15 members appointed by the President.

The Council shall review the operations of the Federal programs for the training and development of educational personnel, and evaluating their effectiveness in meeting needs for additional educational personnel. The Council makes an annual report to the President and the Congress on its findings and recommendations.
