THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate L.J. Andolsek, of Bethesda, Maryland, to be a Civil Service Commissioner for a term of six years expiring on March 1, 1981. This is a reappointment.

Mr. Andolsek has served since 1963 on the Civil Service Commission, and was reappointed on April 29, 1969. During 1963 he was Chief Clerk of the House Committee on Public Works. From January 1951 until December 1962, he was Administrative Assistant to former Congressman John A. Blatnik of the Eighth District of Minnesota. He was a civilian Personnel Officer at Ellsworth Air Force Base in Weaver, South Dakota, from November 1950 until January 1951. He was employed by the Veterans Administration Hospital of St. Cloud, Minnesota, as Assistant to the Personnel Officer from January 1947 to November 1950. He was with the National Youth Administration for Minnesota from January 1936 to June 1942.

A native of Denver, Colorado, Mr. Andolsek was born on November 6, 1910. He received his B.E. degree from St. Cloud College in 1935. He served in the United States Air Force from 1942 until 1946.

Mr. Andolsek is married to the former Regina A. Burnett and they have one child.
