These proposed amendments withdraw a request for funding of a retrievable surface storage facility for nuclear waste. This withdrawal is necessary because the required completion date of this facility has been extended due to expected regulatory changes and because of a delay in the preparation of the environmental impact statement.

I have carefully reviewed the proposal for appropriations contained in this document and am satisfied that this request is necessary at this time. I recommend, therefore, that this proposal be transmitted to the Congress.
