NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President today announced his intention to nominate James B. Young, of Franklin, Indiana, to be United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana for a term of four years. He will succeed Stanley B. Miller who resigned effective March 1, 1975.

Mr. Young has been a partner in the law firm of Young and Huddlestone since 1974, after having practiced law with Richard Vandiver from 1966 to 1974.
