The President today announced his intention to nominate Garth Marston, of Seattle, Washington, to be a member of the Federal Home Loan Bank Board for the term expiring June 30, 1979.

Since April 10, 1974, he has been a member of the Board, serving a term which expires on June 30, 1975. From 1967 to 1974, he was Vice President for marketing and legislative relations and a member of the officers executive committee and loan committee of the Washington Mutual Savings Bank. He was assistant vice president of Securities Mortgage Company (now Firstbank Mortgage) from 1962 to 1967.

He was born on April 28, 1926, in Oakland, California. Mr. Marston was graduated from the University of California at Berkeley in 1948 and from the Savings and Loan Graduate School, Bloomington, Indiana, in 1961. From 1949 to 1954, he was a salesman for Continental Can Company, and from 1955 to 1962 he was vice president and branch manager of Washington Federal Savings and Loan Association.

Mr. Marston and his wife, Shirley, have three sons and two daughters. They reside in Seattle.
