THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate George S. Ives, of Bethesda, Maryland, for reappointment to be a member of the National Mediation Board for a term expiring July 1, 1978. He was appointed to the Board on September 19, 1969 and reappointed June 28, 1972 for a term which expires July 1, 1975.

Prior to his appointment, Mr. Ives was an attorney in the firm of Mehler and Ives, Washington, D.C. From 1953 to 1959 he was Administrative Assistant to his father, United States Senator Irving M. Ives of New York.

Mr. Ives was born on January 10, 1922, in Brooklyn, New York. He received his A.B. degree in 1943 from Dartmouth College and his LL.B. degree from Cornell University Law School in 1949. Following graduation from Cornell, he served as a legal assistant to the Chairman of the National Labor Relations Board until 1950. He was then employed as an associate attorney with Simpson, Thatcher and Bartlett in New York City.

Mr. Ives is married to the former Barbara K. Turner and they have two children.
