The President's Schedule

The President arrived in the Oval Office at 7:40 a.m.

At 8:00 a.m., he met with Bipartisan Congressional Leaders in the Cabinet Room for about 90 minutes. During the meeting, he advised the leaders on his decision involving energy, reported on regulatory reform and again discussed Turkish aid.

The President's participation in the Fifth Annual HEROES, Inc. Golf Tournament was canceled due to rain. The President spent the remainder of the morning in meetings with members of his staff.

At 1:50 p.m., the President will leave the White House by motorcade to attend the swearing in of Philip C. Jackson, Jr., as a member of the Federal Reserve Board. The swearing in will begin at 2:00 p.m. at the Federal Reserve Building and the President will have brief remarks. Mr. Jackson was nominated by the President to fill the unexpired term of John Sheehan, who resigned June 1,1975. His term runs through 1982. A travel pool will accompany the President, who is expected to return to the White House at 2:30 p.m.

At 4:00 p.m., the President will receive diplomatic credentials from Ambassadors of five foreign countries. They are Ferenc Esztergalyos of the Hungarian People's Republic; Jack Hamilton Warren of Canada; Khalid Muhammad Jaffar of the State of Kuwait; Rafael Maximiano Vazquez of the Republic of Argentina; and Roberto Gaja of Italy. There will be photo coverage.

At 5:30 p.m. the President will meet with the three United States Representatives to the United Nations World Conference for International Women's Year. They are Patricia Hutar, head of the U. S. Delegation and United States Representative on the U. N. Commission on the Status of Women; Jewel LaFontant, former Deputy Solicitor General of the Department of Justice and U. S. Representative of the Conference; and Jill Ruckelshaus, Presiding Officer of the National Commission on the Observance of International Women's Year and U. S. Representative to the Conference. Also attending will be Patricia Lindh, Special Assistant to the President for Women and Alternate U. S. Representative to the Conference. The purpose of the meeting is to receive the official report

for the conference and to discuss the conference with the U.S. delegates. The meeting was held in Mexico City from June 19 to July 2, 1975. There will be photo coverage of the President and the three United States Representatives.

On Tuesday, July 15 about 8:00 a.m., President Ford will go to the State Department adultorium to watch T. V. coverage of the launch of the Soviet Soyuz space craft which will link up with American Apollo.

The President will watch the launch with Ambassador Dobrynin of the Soviet Union and other members of the diplomatic corps and Dr. James Fletcher--Administrator of NASA.

The President will have remarks prior to the launch. There will be full press coverage.
