
(Insert the above heading and the following paragraph thereunder immediately following the account "Salaries and expenses":)

To fund payments by the Interstate Commerce Commission to railroads directed to provide emergency rail service over the lines of another carrier in accordance with Section 1(16)(b) of the Interstate Commerce Act, \$21,600,000: Provided, That funds hereby appropriated shall also be available to fund necessary expenses of the Commission incurred in the administration of this Act.

These funds are necessary to reimburse rail carriers for providing service over the lines of the Lehigh and New England Railway Company and the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad Company as required by the Regional Rail Reorganization Act of 1973 (Public Law 93-236). This Act requires the Interstate Commerce Commission to direct one rail carrier to provide necessary service on lines of other carriers which have ceased operations and to provide reimbursements for any losses incurred providing this service.

I have carefully reviewed the proposal for appropriations and am satisfied that it is necessary at this time. I recommend, therefore, that this proposal be transmitted to Congress.
