NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President's Schedule:

The President came to the Oval Office at 7:40 a.m. today and held his usual staff meetings.

At 11:00 a.m. today, the President will meet with his Cabinet in the Cabinet Room. Among the subjects to be covered in the meeting are a review of the President's meetings on regulatory reform, a report on the transfer of the refugee program from the Department of State to the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, and a briefing by FEA Administrator Frank Zarb on the status of the President's energy program.

At 1:15 p.m. today, the President will meet with a Congressional group to discuss pending legislation which would amend the Taft-Hartley Act to permit picketing at construction sites. Such "secondary boycotts" are currently prohibited by the Act. Scheduled to attend the meeting are Senators Hugh Scott, Harrison Williams and Jacob Javits; Congressmen Carl Perkins, Albert Quie, Frank Thompson, Marvin Esch, John Rhodes and John Ashbrook; Secretary of Labor, John Dunlop; Under Secretary of Commerce, John Tabor; OMB Director, James Lynn; Counsellor to the President, Jack Marsh; Assistant to the President, James Cannon; and Assistant to the President, Max Friedersdorf.

At 3:00 p.m., the President will hold one of his weekly meetings with the Vice President.

Postings and Releases

The President is transmitting to the Senate for its advice and consent to ratification the Partial Revision of the Radio Regulations (Geneva 1959). The President's letter of transmittal is available in release form and a State Department report on the revision is available on request in the Press Office.

The President is transmitting to Congress the Fifth Annual Report on Hazardous Materials. Copies of the report are available in the Press Office.
