The President today announced the appointment of four persons as members of the National Advisory Council on Extension and Continuing Education for terms expiring June 30, 1978. They are:

Thomas Aranda, Jr., of Phoenix, Arizona, Senior Partner in the law firm of DePrima, Aranda and deLeon in Phoenix, Arizona. He succeeds Byron Fullerton whose term has expired.

Allen Commander, of Houston, Texas, Vice President for Public Affairs, University of Houston System, Houston, Texas. He succeeds Robert Ray whose term has expired.

Daniel E. Marvin, Jr., of Richmond, Virginia, Director, State Council of Higher Education for Virginia. He succeeds Nicholas A. Panuzio whose term has expired.

Pamela Rogers, of Manning, South Carolina, law student, Washington and Lee University, Lexington, Virginia. She succeeds Julius Mastro whose term has expired.

The Council was established by Public Law 89-329 of November 8, 1965 and its membership consists of 12 members appointed by the President and one representative from each of the following: Department of Agriculture, Commerce, Defense, Labor, Interior, State, Housing and Urban Development, Justice and Small Business Administration.

The Council advises the Commissioner of Education on the preparation of general regulations and policies to eliminate duplication of continuing education programs.
