The President today announced his intention to nominate Thomas Byron Crawford Leddy, of Vienna, Virginia, to be United States Alternate Executive Director of the International Monetary Fund for a term of two years. He will succeed Charles R. Harley whose term expired on June 11, 1975.

Since 1973, Mr. Leddy has served as Deputy Director of the Office of International Monetary Affairs in the Department of the Treasury. He became an International Economist with the Office of Monetary Affairs in April 1970. From January 1968 to April 1970 he was Assistant Financial Attache with the American Embassy in Tokyo. In July 1965 he became an International Economist with the Treasury Department. During 1964-65 he was a research assistant with the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

Mr. Leddy was born on January 27, 1943, in Washington, D.C. He received his B.A. degree from George Washington University in 1964.

Mr. Leddy is married to the former Eileen Bullock and they have two children.
