Dear Mr. Lynn:

Several matters have arisen since submission of the Library of Congress fiscal year 1976 budget request and subsequent action on it by the Congress that, in our opinion, require additional funding in fiscal year 1976 and in the fiscal year 1976 transition quarter.

The Library of Congress is experiencing a great increase in the number of visitors as we approach the Bicentennial year. This trend is expected to intensify in 1976. Present staffing levels of Library Special Police, Tour Leaders, Information Assistants, and custodial personnel are inadequate to handle the anticipated crowds. Consequently, we are requesting an additional fourteen positions in the above categories in order to properly serve the Bicentennial crowds. Funding requirements for these positions amount to \$70,800 for six months in fiscal year 1976 beginning January 1, 1976, and \$36,000 for the transition quarter.

The other matter concerns the storage of valuable collections of nitrate film in vaults provided by the U. S. Air Force at Wright-Patterson Air Field in Dayton, Ohio. We have been notified by the Air Force that major renovation of the air conditioning system is necessary to assure continuous protection of the film. The cost of this renovation is expected to be \$242,000.

We are, therefore, requesting supplemental funding in the Salaries and Expenses, Library of Congress appropriation for fiscal year 1976 in the amount of \$312,800 and \$36,000 in the fiscal year 1976 transition quarter. The required justification and exhibits are enclosed.
