THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate Morton Corn, of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, to be an Assistant Secretary of Labor. His area of responsibility will be Occupational Safety and Health. He will succeed John H. Stender who is resigning.

Mr. Corn is serving as Professor of the Department of Occupational Health, Graduate School of Public Health and Adjunct Professor of the Department of Chemical Engineering at the University of Pittsburgh, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He joined the faculty of the University of Pennsylvania in 1962, serving successively as Assistant Professor, Department of Public Health Practice (1962-1965); Associate Professor, Department of Health Practice (1965-1966); Associate Professor, Department of Occupational Health (1966-1967). During 1961-1962, he was a senior lecturer at the British Medical Research Council at the London School of Hygiene.

Mr. Corn was born on October 18, 1933, in New York, New York, and received his B.Ch.E. degree from Cooper Union in New York. He attended Harvard University where he received his M.S. degree in 1956 and his Ph.D. in 1961. He went to London on a John Simon Guggenheim Fellowship during 1972-1973.

Mr. Corn is married to the former Jacqueline Karnell and they have two children. They reside in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.
