The President today announced his intention to nominate Richard J. Arcara, of Amherst, New York, to be United States Attorney for the Western District of New York for a term of four years. He will succeed John T. Elfvin who was elevated to the position of United States District Judge for the Western District of New York on December 21, 1974.

Mr. Arcara was appointed by the Court as United States Attorney in January 1975.
