NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President today announced his intention to nominate three persons to be members of the Board of Regents of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences for terms expiring May 1, 1981. They are:

Leonard D. Heaton, of Pinehurst, North Carolina, Lieutenant General, United States Army (Medical Corps), Pinehurst, North Carolina. This is a reappointment.

David Packard, of Los Altos, California, Chairman of the Board, Hewlett-Packard Company, Palo Alto, California. This is a reappointment.

Francis D. Moore, M.D., of Boston, Massachusetts, Surgeon-in-Chief, Peter Brent Brigham Hospital and Moseley Professor of Surgery and Chairman, Department of Surgery, Harvard Medical School, Boston, Massachusetts. He will succeed Malcolm C. Todd, whose term expired May 1, 1975.

The President also announced he would designate Mr. Packard to be Chairman of the Board of Regents upon his confirmation by the Senate.

The Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences was created by Public Law 92-42 of September 21, 1972. The Board of Regents consists of nine members appointed by the President, with the advice and consent of the Senate; the Secretary of Defense or his designee; the Surgeons General of the Uniformed Services, and as a nonvoting, ex officio member, the Dean of the University.
