The President today announced the appointment of four persons as members of the Citizens' Advisory Committee on Environmental Quality for terms expiring May 3, 1978. They are:

James S. Gilmore, Jr., of Kalamazoo, Michigan, President, Gilmore Broadcasting Corporation, Kalamazoo, Michigan. This is a reappointment.

Thomas L. McCall, of Portland, Oregon, Radio/Television Commentator, Newspaper Columnist, and former Governor, Portland, Oregon. This is a reappointment.

James L. Taft, Jr., of Cranston, Rhode Island, Mayor, City of Cranston, Rhode Island. He will succeed Lelan F. Sillin, Jr., whose term has expired.

Harrison L. Richardson, Cumberland, Maine, partner in the law firm of Richardson, Hildreth, Tyler and Troubh, Portland, Maine. He succeeds Robert Cahn whose term has expired.

The Committee was established by Executive Order on May 29, 1969, to advise the President and the Council on Environmental Quality on matters affecting environmental quality.
