John Carlson came back with some schedule information. That was all.

On Saturday morning, the President will receive the Annual Report of the Council on the Status of Women. He will also work on a speech for Monday before the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

On Sunday, Carlson said "golf is always a possibility". The President will not go to morning services, instead planning to attend a 5:30 p. m. prayer service at St. John's. Ford was invited to this by Reverend John Harper. The President will take part in the service, reading a lesson from the New Testament. Carlson did not know if Ford will select the lesson.

On Monday, he will address the Chamber of Commerce at 10 a. m. Carlson said the speech will deal with the FY 1977 budget.

Georgia has 48 delegates to the Republican convention at stake in the May 4 primary. Three are chosen in each of the 10 Congressional districts on a winner-take-all basis. The other 13 go to the statewide winner of the primary.

At 12:15 p. m. on Monday, Ambassador Margita Maytag to Nepal will make a farewell call on Ford. At 2:45 p. m., Attorney General Levi, Domestic Council boss James Cannon and legal counsel Phil Buchen will meet with Ford on the drug message, which is to go to Congress on Tuesday. At 5:30 p. m., the President will host a reception at the White House for state CCP Chairmen from the Midwest.
