This proposed amendment would provide for the development of a new passport document and issuance system and for the implementation of an improved passport files storage and retrieval system. These systems are necessary because of the increased workload of the Passport Office.

insert in lieu thereof the following:) \$277,545,453: Provided, That \$3,545,453 of this appropriation shall be available only upon enactment of authorizing legislation.

This proposed amendment would enable the United States to pay assessment arrearages for 1974 to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) to maintain voting privileges during the October 1976 General Conference of that organization.

I have carefully reviewed these budget requests and I am satisfied that they are necessary at this time. I recommend, therefore, that these proposals be transmitted to the Congress.
