

For expenses necessary to carry out the provisions of Title II of the Public Documents Act of December 19, 1974 as amended (Public Law 93-526), \$445,000.

This proposed amendment would provide funding for an eight month extension of the Commission's operations. This extension was authorized by Public Law 94-261 enacted April 11, 1976.

I have carefully reviewed this amendment and am satisfied that this request is necessary at this time. I recommend, therefore, that this proposal be transmitted to the Congress.
