## FACT SHEET

The President's Announcement of Revised Export Control Regulations for General Aviation Aircraft

Effective today, all Department of Commerce export license requirements will be eliminated for general aviation aircraft incorporating only standard communications equipment, and destined to most nations.

Standard equipment refers to communications equipment limited to 108-136 MHz(megahertz) communication equipment with not more than 720 channels at not less than 25 KHz(kilohertz) spacing.

For foreign policy reasons, licenses will still be required for exports to certain Arab countries, the Republic of South Africa, Southwest Africa (Namibia), Gabon, Angola, and to those countries to which there are trade restrictions (i.e., Rhodesia, Cambodia, Vietnam, the Soviet Bloc, etc.).

Exporters of aircraft with more sophisticated electronics equipment will be able to obtain large volume distribution licenses for non-military aircraft designed to carry no more than 25 persons, including crew, regardless of the communications and navigation equipment installed. The distribution licenses will permit exporters to ship products freely to named distributors with the same exceptions listed above.

With these new export regulations, some three to four thousand license applications annually will be replaced by a dozen or so. This action is intended to remove hindrances to exports of general aviation aircraft, expand domestic employment in the aviation industry as a result of increased foreign sales, and reduce the cost of government.

The President made announcement of this change to the Board of Directors of the General Aviation Manufacturers Association (GAMA). GAMA represents the 35 companies that manufacture 99 percent of the aircraft, engines, avionics, component parts, and pilot supplies in general aviation.

The general aviation industry employs over 250,000 people in the United States. Net billings in 1975 were \$1.03 billion. Historically, about 25 percent of the production has been exported.

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
