THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate David H. Stowe, of Bethesda, Maryland, to be a member of the National Mediation Board for the term expiring July 1, 1979. This is a reappointment. He was appointed on December 3, 1970.

Mr. Stowe was born on September 10, 1910, in New Canaan, Connecticut. He attended Duke University and received his B.A. degree in 1931 and his M.E. in 1934. He taught history and economics in Junior Colleges from 1931 to 1937.

In 1937, Mr. Stowe became Assistant Director of the North Carolina State Employment Service and joined the Bureau of the Budget in 1941, prior to serving as Chief Examiner from 1943 to 1947.

Mr. Stowe joined the White House staff in 1947 serving as Deputy to the Assistant to the President until 1949, when he became Administrative Assistant to the President, serving until 1953.

From 1953 until his appointment to the National Mediation Board, Mr. Stowe was a labor arbitrator. He also served as a member of the President's Missile Sites Labor Commission (1961-1967), the Atomic Energy Labor-Management Relations Panel and four Presidential Emergency Boards appointed under the Railway Labor Act.

Mr. Stowe is married to the former Mildred Walker and they have two children. They reside in Bethesda, Maryland.
