DORADO BEACH HOTEL - SUNDAY MCRNING - ADDENDUM 4 (FINAL)
to POOL REPORT #3

John Carlson told departing pool that Nessen will appear in the briefing room (either White House or International) no earlier than 8:30 p.m. today. He will have with him Alan Greenspan, Helmut Sonnenfeldt and perhaps others from American delegation to brief. Meeting of the seven leaders was to convene at 4 p.m. in the Salon del Mar room in the Terrace Wing of the Dorado Beach Hotel. According to description of White House staff, the room (which pool was not allowed to see) is approximately 40 feet by 25 feet. The leaders will sit around a seven-sided table with a hollow center especially constructed for this meeting. The table is made of wood. The curtains are white with a black and brown spiral design. The room overlooks the ocean. Along one wall are the flags of each nation and five translation booths are along another. The foreign and finance ministers of each country will sit with the head of government. A note taker -- a high official--will sit behind each delegation.

Carlson said that after Ford's opening statement, the loose agenda calls for a discussion of the economic recovery and expansion, including recent economic developments, prospects for the future and various monetary and financial issues. Tomorrow subjects include trade, investment, north-south relationships and energy. From sources close to a foreign delegation, the pool learned that aid to Italy will be discussed here.
