NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President today announced the appointment of four persons as members of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation. They are:

Thomas B. Muths, of Jackson, Wyoming, architect, Thomas B. Muths and Associates. He succeeds John A. May who is deceased. This is for a term expiring February 28, 1978.

Alexander Aldrich, of Greenfield Center, New York, attorney with the law firm of Helm, Shapiro, Ayers, Anito and Aldrich, Saratoga Springs, New York. He succeeds Mayhew W. Dodson III who is deceased. This is for a term expiring February 28, 1979.

Bruce K. Chapman, of Seattle, Washington, Secretary of State, State of Washington, Olympia, Washington. He succeeds Mrs. Carl L. Shipley whose term has expired. This is for a term expiring February 28, 1981.

Harold L. Kennedy, of Palestine, Texas, retired, formerly Assistant General Counsel, government affairs for Marathon Oil Company. This is a reappointment for a term expiring February 28, 1981.

The Council was established by Public Law 89-665 of November 15, 1966, for the purpose of advising the President and the Congress on historic preservation matters, encouraging public participation, and to recommend legislative and administrative measures.
