Lawrence Semski, of Mississippi, Judge of the Harrison County Family Court, Gulfport, Mississippi. He succeeds C. Joseph Anderson, whose term has expired.

George Walker Smith, of California, Pastor of the Golden Hill United Presbyterian Church of San Diego, California. He succeeds William P. Hogoboom, whose term has expired.
