Biographical Information

On August 25, 1976, the President named Douglas Bailey to serve as a Co-Chairman of Campaign '76 with John D. Deardourff.

Born in 1933, in Cleveland, Ohio, Mr. Bailey graduated from Colgate University with an A. B. degree and The Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy with both an M. A. and Ph. D. degree.

From 1967 to the present Mr. Bailey has been a Partner in the political consulting and advertising firm of Bailey, Deardourff & Eyre, Inc., Washington, D. C. Prior to this he served on the national political staff of Nelson Rockefeller from 1962 to 1964 and as Staff Director of "Wednesday Group" of GOP Congressmen. He also served as an assistant to Dr. Henry A. Kissinger at Harvard from 1958 to 1962.
