THE WHITE HOUSE

The President announced today his intention to nominate Richard Gilbert Quick, of Julian, Pennsylvania, to be a member of the Interstate Commerce Commission for a term expiring December 31, 1982. He will succeed Kenneth H. Tuggle, who resigned effective July 31, 1975. Mr. Quick has been Administrative Assistant to Senator Hugh Scott of Pennsylvania since May 1975.

The President today also announced his intention to withdraw the nomination of Warren B. Rudman at Mr. Rudman's request. He was nominated on February 4, 1976.

Born on August 8, 1942, in Bellfonte, Pennsylvania, Mr. Quick received his B.A. degree from the University of Puget Sound in Tacoma, Washington and his M.P.A. from American University. He served in the United States Army Corps of Engineers as a Captain from 1967 to 1970.

In 1963, Mr. Quick joined the Department of Commerce as an Engineer Technician/Computer Specialist. He became a Systems Analyst for the U.S. Veterans Administration in 1974, prior to joining the staff of Senator Hugh Scott as a Special Assistant. He became Legislative Assistant in 1974, serving until 1975 when he became Administrative Assistant.

Mr. Quick is married to the former Phyllis Ellane Spotts and they have two children. They reside in Springfield, Virginia.
