NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President today named Alden G. Barber, of Menlo Park, California, to be a member of the Board of Governors of the United Services Organizations, Inc., for a term expiring February, 1979. He will succeed Edward J. Piszek, whose term has expired.

The President today also designated four persons as members persons as members of the Corporation. They are:

For a term expiring February, 1978:

Daniel M. Galbreath, of Columbus, Ohio, Chief Executive, John W. Galbreath Company. He succeeds Raymond Bell, whose term expired in February, 1975.

For a term expiring February, 1979:

Paula Unruh, of Tulsa, Oklahoma, Chairman, Oklahoma Republican Party.

Cary Grant, of Beverly Hills, California, actor. He succeeds Lita Baron, whose term expired February, 1976.

Bernard Ziegler, of West Bend, Wisconsin, Chairman of the Board, The Ziegler Company, Inc. He succeeds Charlton Heston, whose term expired February, 1976.

The President, under the by-laws of the Corporation, is requested to name 6 persons to the Board of Governors and 9 persons as Members of the Corporation, for staggered terms of three years.

The USO is a voluntary civilian agency responsible to the President of the U. S. and the Secretary of Defense, through which the people may serve the religious, spiritual, social, welfare and educational needs of the men and women in the Armed Forces at home and overseas.
