The President today announced the appointment of seven persons as members of the National Transportation Policy Study Commission. These are new positions created by Public Law 94-280 of May 5, 1976. They are:

Benjamin F. Biaggini, of San Francisco, California, Chairman, Southern Pacific Company.

Gilbert E. Carmichael, of Meridian, Mississippi, President, The Carriage House, Inc. and outgoing Chairman of the National Highway Traffic Safety Advisory Committee.

Alvin L. Feldman, of Englewood, Colorado, President and Chief Executive Officer, Frontier Airlines, Denver, Colorado.

Richard L. Herman, of Omaha, Nebraska, President, Herman Brothers, Inc., Omaha, Nebraska.

James C. McConnon, of Wynnewood, Pennsylvania, Chairman of the Board, Southeastern Transit Authority, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

James D. Pitcock, Jr., of Houston, Texas, President, William Brothers Construction Company.

The Commission shall make a full and complete investigation and study of the transportation needs and of the resources, requirements, and policies of the United States to meet such expected needs.

The Commission shall no later than December 31, 1978, submit to the President and the Congress its final report, including its findings and recommendations.
