The President today announced the appointment of seven persons as members of the Board of Trustees of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. They are:

Robert S. Carter, of the District of Columbia, Co-Chairman of the Republican National Committee, Washington, D. C. This is for the remainder of a term expiring September 1, 1980. He succeeds Ralph E. Becker, who has resigned.

For a term expiring September 1, 1986:

Mrs. Howard H. Baker, of Huntsville, Tennessee, Wife of Senator Howard H. Baker. She succeeds Harry McPherson, whose term has expired.

Robert S. Carter, of the District of Columbia, Co-Chairman of the Republican National Committee, Washington, D. C. He succeeds Ralph Becker, who has resigned.

Orval Hansen, of Idaho Falls, Idaho, Partner, Pucell, Hansen and Valdez (law firm); former Congressman, Washington, D. C. He succeeds Arthur Schlesinger, whose term has expired.

Dolores Hope, of Toluca Lake, California, Leader in Civic and Cultural Activities; Founding President and Chairman of the Board, Eisenhower Medical Center, Palm Springs; Founder, Los Angeles Music Center, Benefactor Los Angeles County Museum of Art; and Founding President, St. Joseph's Hospital and Holy Family Adoption Service, Los Angeles, Toluca Lake, California. She succeeds Ralph W. Ellison, whose term has expired.

John G. Spatuzza, of Oak Park, Illinois, Partner, Law Firm of Spatuzza and Spatuzza, Chicago, Illinois. He succeeds Richard Adler, whose term has expired.

Roger L. Stevens, of the District of Columbia, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, Washington, D. C. This is a reappointment.

Jack J. Valenti, of Houston, Texas, President, Motion Picture Association of America, Inc., Washington, D. C. This is a reappointment.

The Board of Trustees consists of thirty members serving staggered terms of ten years.
