The President today announced the appointment of three persons as members of the National Highway Safety Advisory Committee. They are:

R.M. Stovall, of Fort Worth, Texas, President,
Panther City Office Supply Company. He succeeds
Richard C. Tufaro who has resigned. For a term
expiring March 15, 1977.

For a term expiring March 15, 1979

George F. Berlinger, of New York, New York,
President, Governor's Club. He succeeds Gilbert
Carmichael whose term has expired.

Ivan J. Wagar, of San Pedro, California, President,
Safety Helmet Council of America, Los Angeles, California.
He succeeds William F. Cellini whose term has expired.

The Committee consists of thirty-five members appointed by the President for terms of three years and the Secretary of Transportation, Federal Highway Administrator and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administrator as ex-officio members.

The Committee was established by Public Law 39-564 of September 9, 1966 to provide advice and counsel to the Secretary of Transportation on Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards and other highway safety matters.
