The President today announced the appointment of two persons as members of the Commission on Postal Service. The Commission was established by Public Law 94-421 of September 24, 1976.

They are:

Kent Rhodes, of Chappaqua, New York, President, Reader's Digest Foundation, Pleasantville, New York.

Hobart Taylor, Jr., of the District of Columbia, Partner in the law firm of Dawson, Quinn, Riddell, Taylor and Davis, Washington, D.C.

The President today also announced the designation of Gaylord Freeman, of Wayne, Illinois, as Chairman of the Postal Service Commission. Mr. Freeman, former ~~Chairman~~ Chairman of the First National Bank of Chicago, is currently the Honorary Chairman of the Board in Chicago, Illinois.

The Commission shall identify and study the problems facing the U. S. Postal Service and recommend actions to be taken to resolve those problems.

The Commission shall transmit to the President and to the Congress a final report on or before March 15, 1977.
