NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President today announced the appointment of Joseph P. Tonelli, of Yonkers, New York, to be a member of the Advisory Committee for Trade Negotiations for a term of two years. He succeeds Nathaniel Goldfinger who is deceased.

Mr. Tonelli is President of the United Paperworkers International Union of Flushing, New York and has held that position since September 1965. He has been Vice President of the Industrial Union Department and a member of the Executive Council for the AFL-CIO.

The Committee consists of not more than 45 individuals, and shall include representatives of government, labor, industry, agriculture, small business, service industries, retailers, consumer interests, and the general public.

The Committee meets at the call of the Special Representative for Trade Negotiations, who shall be the Chairman of the Committee.

The Committee shall issue a report to the Congress as soon as is practical after the end of the period which ends 5 years after the date of enactment of Public Law 93-618 of January 3, 1975.
