1. PRCLO AMBASSADOR HUANG CHEN WAS ASKED TO CALL TODAY AT WHITE HOUSE AT 4:45 P.M. HE WAS ACCOMPANIED BY INTERPRETER CHI CHAO-CHU.

2. HUANG FIRST HAD TWENTY MINUTE DISCUSSION WITH SECRETARY KISSINGER (LORD, HUMMEL, SOLOMON ALSO PRESENT). THEN SECRETARY ACCOMPANIED HUANG AND CHI TO PRIVATE CALL ON PRESIDENT FORD FOR TWENTY MINUTES.

5. SECRETARY, ON BEHALF OF HIMSELF AND ALSO PRESIDENT FORD, STRESSED CONTINUITY OF US POLICY, BIPARTISAN BACKING, ESPECIALLY FOR CHINA POLICY, AND VALIDITY OF ALL PAST DISCUSSIONS AND UNDERSTANDINGS. HUANG EXPRESSED PLEASURE THAT SECRETARY IS REMAINING IN OFFICE, SPOKE WARMLY OF CONTRIBUTIONS PRESIDENT NIXON HAD MADE TO US/CHINA RELATIONS AND TO WORLD PEACE, AND EXPRESSED SATISFACTION WITH SECRETARY'S STATEMENT THAT USG FULLY COMMITTED TO CARRYING OUT THE SHANGHAI COMMUNIQUE. XISSINGER BT

SUBJECT: HUANG CHEN CALL ON THE PRESIDENT

1. PRESIDENT FORD RECEIVED PROLO CHIEF HUANG CHEN IN THE OVAL OFFICE ON AUGUST 9 FOR FIFTEEN MINUTES. THE PRESIDENT COMMENTED ON HIS 1972 TRIP TO PROOF HE EXPRESSED COMMITMENT TO THE THINGS PRESIDENT NIXON AND SECRETARY KISSINGER HAD DONE WITH THE CHINESE GOVERNMENT AND AFFIRMED HIS BELIEF IN THE NEW RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE U.S. AND PROOF.

- 2. HUANG REPLIED THAT PRC WOULD NOT FORGET MR. NIXON'S CONTRIBUTION IN VISITING CHINA AND ISSUING SHANGHAI COMMUNIQUE. HE EXPRESSED APPRECIATION FOR U.S. CARRYING OUT THE TERMS OF THE COMMUNIQUE AND SAID PRC WOULD OPERATE ON THAT SAME BASIS. HE ADDED THAT HE WAS PLEASED TO HAVE MET MR. FORD WHEN HE WAS MINORITY LEADER, AND BELIEVED U.S. CHINA POLICY HAD BIPARTISAN SUPPORT.
- 3. PRESIDENT ADDED U.S. WOULD NOT LET ITS OTHER INTER-NATIONAL RELATIONS DISTURB NEW U.S.-PRC RELATIONSHIP, AND THAT AMERICAN PEOPLE LOOKED FORWARD TO THE STRENGTHEN-ING OF THAT RELATIONSHIP.
- 4. IN CONCLUSION, HUANG ASKED THAT HIS WIFE'S GOOD WISHES BE EXTENDED TO MRS. FORD. WHEN PRESIDENT RECALLED

FIRST LADY HAD PREVIOUSLY VISITED MRS. HUANG AT HER NEW WASHINGTON HOME, HUANG REQUESTED OPPORTUNITY FOR HIS WIFE TO PAY COURTESY CALL ON MRS. FORD. KISSINGER

1. ON BASIS OF GO-AHEAD FROM WHITE HOUSE, SOLOMON OF NSC CONTACTED PRCLO AUGUST 14 TO REACTIVATE PLANNING ON CONGRESSIONAL TRIP. HE PROPOSED THAT DELEGATION ARRIVE APPROXIMATELY SEPTEMBER 2 AND DEPART APPROXIMATELY SEPTEMBER 14, WITH ITINERARY INCLUDING SHANGHAI, PEKING (THREE OR FOUR DAYS), SHENYANG, CHANGSHA, SHAOSHAN, HANGCHOW AND SHANGHAI. HE INFORMED PRCLO THAT DELEGATION EXPECTED TO BE HEADED BY HOUSE MINORITY LEADER JOHN RHODES AND TO HAVE ABOUT TWELVE MEMBERS (FIVE TO SEVEN SENATORS AND CONGRESSMEN, SOME WITH WIVES) WITH STAFF OF FOUR TO SIX. CHINESE "TOOK NOTE" OF PROPOSAL AND INDICATED THEY WOULD REPORT TO PEKING.

2. IN ANSWER TO PARTS OF REFTEL B, IF CHINESE AGREE TO PROPOSAL, WE PLAN IN DISCUSSING DETAILS OF TRIP TO PROPOSE THAT AN OFFICER AND A WIFE FROM USLO ACCOMPANY GROUP ON TRAVELS WITHIN PRC. WE ARE EASY ON WHETHER THESE ARE A CHINESE-SPEAKING COUPLE OR A CHINESE-SPEAKING OFFICER AND ANOTHER OFFICER'S CHINESE-SPEAKING WIFE, BUT NEED NAMES ASAP FOR INCLUSION IN LIST TO BE SUBMITTED TO PRCLO. WE DO NOT NOW EXPECT THAT ANY STAFF MEMBERS OF

CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES, OR ANY NEWSMEN WILL ACCOMPANY. WILL KEEP YOU CLOSELY INFORMED ON DEVELOPMENTS.

I. WE ARE BRIEFING CODEL ON FRIDAY AND WILL LET YOU KNOW IF THAT SESSION RESULTS IN ANYTHING THAT WILL BE HELPFUL TO YOU IN YOUR BRIEFING OF CODEL. CFYI, SENATOR FULBRIGHT WILL BE OUT OF TOWN AND WILL NOT ATTEND). BROOKS AND SOLOMON CAN ALSO ALERT YOU TO POINTS WHICH ARISE IN DISCUSSIONS EN ROUTE TO PRC.

2. MEANWHILE, WE INTEND TO TRY TO HANDLE POINTS YOU MENTIONED ALONG FOLLOWING LINES:

A. CLAIMS/ASSETS. THERE ARE SOME SPECIFIC POINTS WHICH HAVE NOT YET BEEN RESOLVED. (WE HOPE TO AVOID IDENTIFYING THEM). HOWEVER, RECENT CHINESE RESPONSES TO OUR PROPOSALS ALSO SEEM TO SUGGEST THAT THE PRC MAY NOT BE ANXIOUS TO CONCLUDE THE AGREEMENT IN THE NEAR FUTURE. PERHAPS THEY HAVE DECIDED THAT A FORMAL INTER-GOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ON CLAIMS/ASSETS WOULD BE POLITICALLY SENSITIVE IN THE PRC AND ALSO INAPPROPRIATE AT THIS STAGE OF OUR RELATIONSHIP. IN ANY EVENT, WE ARE UNABLE TO ESTIMATE WITH ANY CONFIDENCE WHEN THE MATTER CAN BE SETTLED.

B. MFN. IN THE PAST, WE HAVE INDICATED TO THE PRC THAT WE WOULD BE PREPARED TO DISCUSS MEN ONCE THE CLAIMS/ASSETS PROBLEM IS OUT OF THE WAY. THE CHINESE SAY THEY WOULD EVENTUALLY LIKE MFN, BUT HAVE TOLD US THAT THEY ARE PREPARED TO LET THE MATTER FALL INTO PLACE AT THE PROPER TIME. OUR OWN ESTIMATE IS THAT MFN WOULD IN ITSELF INCREASE PRC EXPORTS TO THE US ONLY ABOUT 15 PERCENT AND

THEREFORE WOULD NOT COME CLOSE TO REDRESSING THE TRADE IMBALANCE. ONCE WE START DISCUSSING MFN WITH THE PRC, WE MAY HAVE A PROBLEM OF OBTAINING "COMPARABLE BENEFITS", PARTICULARLY IN VIEW OF THE LARGE TRADE IMBALANCE IN OUR FAVOR.

C. USLO-EMBASSY SWITCH. WE PLAN TO AVOID ANY DETAILED DISCUSSION WITH CODEL OF FULL NORMALIZATION AND POST-NORMALIZATION RELATIONS WITH TAIWAN. IN BRIEFING CODEL, WE DO NOT WANT TO RULE OUT SOMETHING LIKE USLO-EMBASSY SWITCH IN CASE THEY MAKE SOME COMMENT TO PRC OFFICIALS WHICH MIGHT BE MISINTERPRETED. INSTEAD, WE WILL TRY TO HANDLE THIS POINT. IF IT ARISES, ALONG LINES THAT WE DO NOW KNOW WHAT TYPE OF RESIDUAL USG PRESENCE IN TAIWAN WILL BE FEASIBLE, ALTHOUGH PAST EXAMPLES, E.G. JAPANESE, INDICATE PRC PREFERS SOMETHING NOT TOO OPENLY OFFICIAL. KISSING BT

THAT BILATERAL OR PERHAPS INTERNATIONAL NEGOTIATIONS WOULD BE HELD. AS CONCERNS STATEMENT BY USG, DEPTOFF ASSURED NZ EMBOFF THAT HE WOULD BE PREPARED TO ISSUE STATEMENT SUPPORTING THE FRIENDLY RESOLUTION BUT THAT IT APPEARED TOO EARLY TO TALK ABOUT LESSENING MILITARY ASSISTANCE,

J. NZ EMBOFF ALSO INQUIRED AS TO HOW US ENVISAGES
THE NEXT STEP AFTER THE UN VOTE. HE WONDERED WHETHER
CONTACT WITH SIHANOUK/GRUNK COULD BE MADE BY A THIRD
PARTY SUCH AS AUSTRALIA OR FRANCE. DEPTOFF ANSWERED THAT
EITHER SUCH A STEP OR MORE PROBABLY AN EFFORT BY THE UN
SECRETARY-GENERAL COULD BE USED SINCE LATTER MANDATED ACT
BY FRIENDLY RESOLUTION. THE LATTER WOULD BE ABLE TO
ASCERTAIN THE POSSIBILITIES OF BILATERAL OR PERHAPS MULTILATERAL NEGOTIATIONS AND WOULD SEEM TO OFFER A NEUTRAL GOBETWEEN.

A. AT CLOSE OF CONVERSATION, NZ EMBOFF PROMISED TO KEEP DEPARTMENT INFORMED OF ANY FURTHER CONVERSATIONS WITH JAPANESE ON THIS MATTER. HE PARTICULARLY REQUESTED THAT THIS INFORMATION BE CLOSELY HELD. INGERSOLL
