MME WANG: YOU HAVE TRAVELED IN SINKIANG AND KWANGTUNG AND I HOPE THAT MADAME KANG DIDN'T MAKE YOU TOO TIRED. YOU ARE OUR GUEST AND YOU HAVE TRAVELED A LONG WAY TO VISIT US. AFTER TWO YEARS YOU HAVE RETURNED TO VISIT SINKIANG AND KWANGTUNG. WHAT IS YOUR IMPRESSION OF THESE PLACES.

SEN. MANSFIELD: I WAS VERY IMPRESSED. THIS WAS MY FIRST VISIT TO SINKIANG. I FOUND CALM, COMPETENT PEOPLE IN SINKIANG, INCLUDING THE MINORITY NATIONALITIES. SINKIANG REMINDS MR. DIKEOS AND MYSELF OF OUR OWN STATE OF MONTANA. THE TOPOGRAPHY AND PEOPLE AND PRODUCE ARE COMPARABLE EXCEPT FOR SINKIANG'S PEANUT CROP. I WAS ASTOUNDED WITH THE PROGRESS IN KWANGTUNG. I NOTICED THE VAST INCREASE IN TRAFFIC IN PEKING AND THE WELL-BEING OF THE PEOPLE. THERE HAS BEEN A LOT OF PROGRESS. YOU HAVE COME A LONG WAY IN ACHIEVING STABILITY AND ECONOMIC PROGRESS. THERE IS A LONG WAY STILL TO GO. WE HAVE HAD A VERY HEARTENING EXPERIENCE. WE WERE WELL RECEIVED EVERYWHERE. WE LEARNED A LOT MORE THAN WE KNEW.

MME WANG: ALL THIS PROGRESS HAS BEEN SCORED UNDER THE CORRECT LEADERSHIP OF CHAIRMAN MAD, BY IMPLEMENTING THE CORRECT LINES OF CHAIRMAN MAD AND BY THE GUIDANCE AND BRILLIANCE OF CHAIRMAN MAD'S THOUGHT. OF COURSE WHAT WE HAVE ACHIEVED IS NOT ENOUGH, IN THE DAYS AHEAD. MME WANG: WELL, I FEEL, UNDER THE PRESENT STATE OF AFFAIRS, THE STATE OF RELATIONS BETWEEN CHINA AND THE UNITED STATES COULD ONLY BE WHAT IT IS AT THE MOMENT.

SEN. MANSFIELDS I TAKE IT, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF TAIWAN, THEY ARE SATISFACTORY?

MME WANG: WELL, IN THE PRESENT WORLD OUR TWO COUNTRIES SHARE MANY COMMON POINTS, TAIWAN IS A SMALL POINT, INTERNATIONAL ISSUES ARE IN COMPARISON BIG ISSUES.

SEN. MANSIFLED: THERE ARE WORLD ISSUES AND THE CHINESE POSITION AS LEADER OF THE THIRD WORLD NATIONS IS WELL KNOWN, AS IS CHINESE SYMPATHY WITH UNDER-DEVELOPED NATIONS.

AS FAR AS THE QUESTION OF SINO-US TRADE IS CONCERNED, AFTER PRESIDENT NIXON'S VISIT TRADE INTIALLY WAS HEAVILY IN OUR FAVOR, BUT THIS SITUATION IS NOT ALLEVIATED AND THE TRADE BALANCE IS EVENING OUT.

WHILE WE WERE IN SINKIANG, CHINA EXPLODED ANOTHER NUCLEAR DEVICE. THIS IS EVIDENCE OF GREAT PROGRESS, BUT CHINA'S POSITION IS NOT IN FAVOR OF CONTROL OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS, CHINA, HOWEVER, IS IN FAVOR OF COMPLETE DISARMAMENT, THIS COULD BE A CONTRADICTION, CHINA IS ALSO IN FAVOR OF NON-FIRST USE OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS. I ALSO AGREE WITH THIS STAND AND I DON'T BELIEVE IN FIRST STRIKES.

IN DIL. OUR IMPORTS CONSTITUTE APPROXIMATELY 50PCT OF OUR ANNUAL REQUIREMENTS AND A GREAT DEAL IS WASTED, YOU, ON THE OTHER HAND, ARE SELF-SUFFICIENT IN OIL. I ASSUME YOU HAVE TREMENDOUS RESERVES. PARTICULARLY IN OFFSHORE OIL RESOURCES AND ON THE CONTINENTAL SHELF AND IN THE POHAL GULF, YOU COULD BE AN OIL EXPORTING NATION IF YOU DESIRED.

IT WOULD APPEAR TO ME THAT TAIWAN SHOULD ALSO BE LOOKED AT IN THE CONTEXT OF MAJOR AND MINOR PROBLEMS. I UNDERSTAND THE TIES OF PEOPLE AND LAND THAT MAKE THIS A VERY AGGRAVATING PROBLEM FOR THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA. IT IS A PROBLEM THAT MUST BE RESOLVED. TAIWAN IS NOT A THREAT TO MAINLAND CHINA BUT MORE A THORN IN ITS SIDE THAT MUST BE RESOLVED AT SOME DUTURE TIME. I SAY THAT IT IS ONLY A THORN IN THE SIDE BECAUSE IT MUST SEEM THAT THERE IS A GUN AT CHINA'S HEAD WITH ONE MILLION SOVIET TROOPS ON CHINA'S BORDER. IN THIS MATTER OF RUSSIA, IT SEEMS THAT WE HAVE A COMMON CONCERN THAT UNITES OUR COUNTRIES. I AGREE COMPLETELY THAT TAIWAN SHOULD BE RESOLVED, BUT THE PROBLEM OF RUSSIA IS A REAL THREAT TO CHINA WHILE TAIWAN IS NOT. WOULD YOU CARE TO COMMENT?

MME WANG: THE SHANGHAI COMMUNIQUE IS VERY CLEAR. IT STATED EXPLICITLY THAT TAIWAN IS A PROVINCE OF CHINA AND THAT IT IS AN INALIENABLE PART OF CHINA. EXDIS MR LT: YOU SEEM TO BE WORKING WITH THE AFRICAN NATIONS NBW. SENATOR MANSFIELD: WE ARE TRYING TO AND HE HOPE TO HELP SOUTHERN AFRICA SEFORE SOMETHING ERUPTS. MR. LI: SUPPORT THEIR INDEPENDENCE. THEY THE AFRICANS WILL BE HAPPY. BEANTOR MANSFIELD: THAT IS WHAT KISSINGER IS TRYING TO ACHIEVE BUT THERE ARE MANY OBSTACLES. MR. LI: OF COURSE ROADS ARE NOT ALWAYS ARROW STRAIGHT. THEY ARE ALWAYS TORTUOUS. SEANTOR MANSFIELDI THE STRAIGHTEST DISTANCE, AS SENATOR BLENN HOULD INDICATE TO YOU, IS NOT ALWAYS A STRAIGHT LINE. MR. LT: YOU ARE RIGHT, VERY RIGHT. ANYWAY, THERE IS ONE THING IN THE WORLD THAT THE SOVIET UNION WANTS AND THAT IS EXPANSION; AND YOU HAVE INTERESTS YOU WANT TO PROTECT. IT IS NOT EASY TO CHANGE THIS SITUATION. SEANTOR MANSFIELD: WE'LL SEE MR. LT: I RECALL YOU HAVE DISCUSSED THE WESTERN PACIFIC AND YOU HAVE ASKED HOW WE SEE THE ISSUE OF YOUR MILITARY FORCES STATIONED THERE. HE BELIEVE IT IS NOT A GOOD THING TO HAVE FORCES ON FOREIGN SOIL. IT SEEMS YOUR SITUATION IN THE WESTERN PACIFIC ALSO IS A RESULT OF THE FACT THAT YOU HAVE INTERESTS THERE TO PROTECT. AS TO HOW YOU GO ABOUT IT IS FOR YOU TO DECIDE. SENATOR MANSFIELD: I APPRECIATE YOUR VIEWS. MR. LI: AS FOR KOREA, I SHOULD THINK YOU HOULD DO A HELL

OF A LOT OF GOOD TO GET THE UNITED NATIONS COMMAND OUT AND TO WITHDRAW U.S. TROOPE. THIS WOULD BE BOTH AN

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AFFIRMATIVE AND POSITIVE ACTION AND WOULD ALLOW NORTH AND SOUTH KOREA TO NORK OUT THEIR OWN PROBLEMS. SEANTOR MANSFIELD: WOULD CHINA JOIN THE UNITED STATES IN TRYING TO BRING ABOUT A SETTLEMENT? EITHER BY FREE ELECTIONS OR BY SOME OTHER HEARS TO BRING ABOUT THE SITUATION THAT CHINA DESIRES. MR. LT: I HAVEN'T STUDIED THAT ISSUE VERY MUCH. BUT OUR VIEW OF THE KOREAN ISSUE IS THAT IT IS UP TO THE KOREAN PEOPLE TO DECIDE THEMSELVES. OUR VIEW IS THAT THE KOREAN PEOPLE SHOULD SOLVE THE ISSUE THROUGH CONTACTS AND DIS-CUSSIONS BETWEEN THEIR TWO SIDES, SENATOR MANSFIELD: I AGREE. MR. LT: HOW CAN WE DO OTHERWISE AND INTERFERE? SENATOR MANSFIELDS - WELL, WHAT WOULD YOU ADVISE. MR. LI: FIRST, WITHDRAW YOUR TROOPS AND DO AWAY WITH THE UNITED NATIONS COMMAND. SEANTOR MANSFIELD: I'LL PASS ALONG YOUR VIEWS. MR. LI: THIS DISCUSSION HAS BEEN BETWEEN YOU AND ME, AND WHETHER YOU WANT TO PASS IT ON IS UP TO YOU. SEANTOR MANSFIELD: PASSING IT ON IS ONE MEANS OF PASSING THE BUCK. MR. LT: OUR CONVERSATION IS FOR OLD FRIENDS AND NOT FOR PUBLICATION. SEANTOR MANSFIELD: YES, BUT SERIOUSLY, I WILL PASS IT ON TO THE PRESIDENT AND TO THE SENATE POREIGN RELATIONS COMMITTEE. MR. LT: I THINK OUR RELATIONS SHOULD SECONE PRIENDLIER STEP BY STEP, BUT SOMETIMES IN OUR NEWSPAPERS AND AT THE UNITED NATIONS WE FIRE A FEW CANNONS -- BUT THESE CANNONS ARE EMPTY. HAVE YOU READ FOREIGN MINISTER CHIAD KUAN-HUA'S SPEECH AT THE UNITED NATIONS? SENATOR MANSFIELD: YES, I HAVE A COPY AND I'VE READ IT WITH INTEREST. MR. LT: HAVE YOU ALSO READ THE MESSAGE OF THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY, THE STANDING COMMITTEE OF THE NATIONAL PEOPLE'S CONGRESS, THE STATE COUNCIL, AND THE MILITARY COMMISSION TO THE WHOLE NATION, AND THE SPEECH MADE BY PREMIER MUA AT THE MEMORIAL MEETING? SENATOR MANSFIELD: YES, I HAVE A COPY OF THE FIRST, BUT NOT THE SECOND. (MR. LI INSTRUCTED HIS AIDES TO OBTAIN A COPY FOR SEN. MANSFIELD). MR. LI: WE ARE TO CARRY ON THE CUASE LEFT BEHIND BY CHAIRMAN MAD AND TO CARRY OUT HIS REVOLUTIONARY LINE WHICH MEANS OUR INTERNAL AND OUR FOREIGN POLICIES WILL

NOT CHANGE.

SENATOR MANSFIELD: MAY I SAY THAT THIS HAS SEEN A YEAR OF GREAT TRADEDY WITH THE PASSING AWAY OF CHOU EN-LAI, CHU TE. AND CHAIRMAN MAD, AS WELL AS THE TANGSHAN EARTH-

BUAKE. MR. LI: THESE HAVE BEEN GREAT LOSSES. THEY WERE ALL OLD CONRADES OF ADVANCED AGE AND HAD SEEN ILL FOR A LONG TIME AND IT HAS A NATURAL INEVITABLE DEVELOPMENT THAT WE WERE UNABLE TO STOP.

EXDIS SENATOR SLENN: THAT CAN BE A MAJOR FACTOR IN CHINA'S RELATIONS WITH THE REST OF THE WORLD, HOW WILL CHINA USE THIS RESOURCE IN INTERNATIONAL COMMERCE? ARE THERE PLANS TO MOVE IN THAT DIRECTION? MR LI: OF COURSE OUR SUBJECTIVE WILL IS TO DEVELOPE THIS RESOURCE AS PRICKLY AS POSSIBLE. AS FOR THE INTERNATIONAL ASPECTS THIS IS A QUESTION OF NECESSITY AND POSSIBILITY. HE ARE HILLING TO DEVELOP PRIENDLY CONTACTS UNDER THE CONDITIONS OF SELF-RELIANCE AND ACCORDING TO THE PRINCIPLES OF NECESSITY AND POSSIBILITY. THERE ARE SOME THIRD HORLD COUNTRIES WHO INVIET FOREIGN INVESTMENT AND BO IN FOR MULTI-NATIONAL CORPORATIONS TO TAP THEIR DIL RESOURCES. ME DO NOT INTEND TO GO IN THAT DIRECTION. AS FOR COMMERICIAL CONTACTS ON THE BASIS OF EQUALITY AND IN THE LIGHT OF NECESSITY AND POSSIBILITY WE ARE MILLING TO DEVELOP SUCH CONTACTS, BUT IN TRADE HE IMPORT MORE FROM YOU THAN YOU FROM US; BUT WE ARE NOT IN GREAT HASTE. SENATOR GLENN: IN FLYING OVER THE VAST REGIONS OF CHINA ONE CAM SEE THAT IT IS SUCH A VAST COUNTRY THAT I DO NOT KNOW IF THE CHINESE KNOW HOW MANY RESOURCES THEY HAVE. MR LI: INDEED THERE ARE LOTS OF RESOURCES WE DO NOT KNOW WE HAVE, BUT HE WILL FIND OUT EVENTUALLY. SENATOR GLENN: YOU HAVE VAST RESOURCES WHICH WILL HELP KEEP YOU SELF-RELIANT. MR LI: HE ALSO EXPORT A LITTLE. FOR INSTANCE, WE EXPORT A LITTLE OIL. SENATOR GLENN: I THINK CHINA COULD BECOME A LARGE EXPORTER OF ENERGY TO THE WORLD.

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HR LIS THAT WORD "LARGE" IS NO VERY RELIABLE. SENATOR GLENN: ME HAVE HERE A WORLD-RENOWNED SCIENTIST, WHO COULD ADVISE US, DR. CHOU PEI-YUAN. SENATOR MANSFIELD: DURING MY VISIT IN 1972 I LEARNED THAT CHINA'S TRADE FOR 1971 OF 2.3 BILLION IN EXPORTS AND 2.1 BILLION IN IMPORTS ALMOST BALANCED. THEN CHINA SOUGHT LARGE AMOUNTS OF GRAIN, SOME AIRPLANES FROM THE UNITED STATES AND SOME MACHINERY IMPORTS FROM JAPAN RESULTING IN AN IMBALANCE IN TRADE, THIS HAS BEEN CORRECTED TO SOME EXTENT, BUT WHAT IS THE BALANCE NOW? MR LT: OUR TRADE IS BASTCALLY BALANCED AT THE PRESENT TIME. SENATOR HANSFIELDS IS IT YOUR POLICY TO KEEP YOUR IMPORTS EQUAL TO YOUR EXPORTS? MR LI: GENERALLY THAT IS SO. SENATOR MANSFIELD: THAT AVOIDS INDEBTEDNESS. WE KNOW THAT IT DOES NOT PEEL GOOD TO BE IN DEBT. MR LIE WE INCURRED SOVIET DESTS AND WITH INTEREST. THEY ALSO SAID IT WAS SELFLESS. THEY FORCED DOWN THE PRICE OF OUR EXPORTS TO THEM AND RAISED THE PRINCE OF THEIR EXPORTS TO US. IS THAT SELFLESS?

SENATOR MANSFIELD: WHAT TO THE BALANCE OF SINO-SOVIET TRADES

MR. LT: THEY ARE IN DEST TO US, BUT IT IS NOT A VERY LARGE DEBT. THE DEST HE INCURRED FROM THE SOVIET UNION WAS INCURRED TO HELP KOREA AGAINST U.S. AGGRESSION WHEN WE FOUGHT YOU. WE BOUGHT AMMUNITION FROM THE SOVIETS AND WE ALSO BORROWED FROM THEM. SENATOR MANSFIELD: YOU USED TO HAVE A LARGE TRADE WITH

THE SOVIET UNION.

MR. LIS INDEED.

SENATOR MANSFIELD: MOST OF YOUR TRADE HAS NOW SHIFTED TO OTHER AREAS.

MR. LT: EIGHTY TO 90 PERCENT OF OUR TRADE NOW GOES TO SECOND AND THIRD WORLD COUNTRIES AND TO YOURSELVES. THE SOVIET UNION IS NOT VERY HAPPY.

SENATOR MANSFIELD: WE ARE.

VICE PREMIER LI THEM ASKED SENATOR MANSFIELD WHICH COUNTRIES HE WAS GOING TO VISIT NEXT AND THEN SUGGESTED THAT THE MEETING BE CONCLUDED. HE STATED ONCE AGAIN THAT THE INTERVIEW WAS NOT FOR PUBLICATION, THAT HE HAD SPOKEN VERY CANDIDLY, AND THE "DEVIOUS TALK, SO DEVIOUS THAT OTHERS DON'T UNDERSTAND YOU IS VERY TASTELESS."

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
