1. SUMMARY: I MET WITH KUZIMIN AND GORDEYEV AT 4:30 THIS AFTERNOON FRIDAY, OCTOBER 17, ACCOMPANIED BY FSO NILES, (PATOLICHEV AND AMB-BASSADOR STOESSEL WERE NOT PRESENT AS THEY WERE BOTH ATTENDING SOVIET RECEPTION FOR FRENCH PRESIDENT GISCARD D'ESTAING.) SUBSEQUENTLY, THE MATTERS DISCUSSED AT THIS MEETING WERE REFERRED BY KUZIMIN TO PATOLICHEV, WHO HAS NOW APPROVED THE POSSIBLE ALTERNATIVE FOR REVISION OF PRICE CLAUSE 6 IN OIL LETTER OF INTENT WHICH HAD BEEN CONSIDERED AT THE MEETING AS REPLACEMENT FOR SIDE LETTER. PATOLICHEV ALSO GAVE FORMAL APPROVAL FOR THE ELIMINATION OF THE 30-DAY LIMITATION IN THE DIL LETTER OF INTENT AND SAID HE WOULD INFORM US AT A MEETING SCHEDULED FOR 1:00 P.M., SATURDAY, OCTOBER 18, OF THE SOVIET POSITION ON PRESIDENT FORD'S STATEMENT IN CONNECTION WITH THE LIFTING OF THE MORATORIUM ON FURTHER GRAIN SALES TO THE USSR.

ACCORDINGLY, I URGE THAT YOU AUTHORIZE ME TO SIGN THE GRAIN AGREEMENT AND THE OIL LETTER OF INTENT TOMORROW, SATURDAY, OCOBTER 18, AT 08:00 P.M. MOSCON TIME (E.G., 24 HOURS FROM NOW) WITH THE FOLLOWING REVISIONS IN THE OIL LETTER OF INTENT: A) DELETE FROM THE INTRODUCTORY PARAGRAPH THE WORDS "WITHIN 30 DAYS" AND REPLACE WITH WORDS "TO COMMENCE NEGOTIATING PROMPTLY"

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AS PROPOSED PARA 4 REF B. B) MODIFY PRICE CLAUSE 6 OF OIL LETTER OF INTENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH TEXT IN PARA 5 BELOW. (THIS WOULD SUBSTITUTE FOR A SIDE LETTER ON CIL PRICING WHICH APPEARS UNOBTAINABLE, AS EXPLAINED IN PARA 4 BELOW.) HE ANTICIPATE NO PROBLEM IN OBTAINING SOVIET ACQUIESCENCE IN A PRESIDENTIAL STATEMENT ON THE LIFTING OF THE MORATORIUM ALONG THE LINES DISCUSSED PARA 4, REF B. END SUMMARY.

3. THIS MEETING LASTED ONE AND ONE-HALF HOURS, DURING WHICH WE ATTEMPTED TO OBTAIN ACCEPTANCE OF OUR SIDE LETTER ON OIL PRICING IN ACCORDANCE WITH INSTRUCTIONS REFTEL A, PARA 3. KUZIMIN REPORTED THAT THEY HAD HAD THE LETTER TRANSLATED, AND THEIR REVIEW CONFIRMED THEIR SUSPICION THAT WE WANTED THE LETTER TO ESTABLISH PUBLICLY THAT THE SOVIETS HAD AGREED TO A PRICE DISCOUNT. HE CITED DATA FROM PLATT'S "DILGRAM" ON 1974 OIL COSTS IN THE U.S. INDICATING AN AVERAGE OF \$7.53 PER BARREL, INCLUDING DOMESTIC PRODUCTION, WHILE THE SAUDI ARABIAN PRICE WAS \$10.835 PER BARREL. HE INTER-PRETED OUR LETTER AS REFLECTING AN INTENT TO USE U.S. COSTS WELL BELOW WORLD MARKET AS A BASE AND THUS CONCLUDED THAT WE WERE ATTEMPTING TO ESTABLISH A DISCOUNT THROUGH THIS FORMULA.

4. I ASSURED KUZIMIN THAT HE HAD MISINTERPRETED OUR LETTER, BUT IT HAS CLEAR THAT THE SOVIETS ARE HIGHLY SUSPICIOUS AND WILL REMAIN ADAMANTLY OPPOSED TO ANY SIDE LETTER CONTAINING TERMS TO WHICH THEY WOULD BE EXPLICITLY COMMITTED. THEY INDICATED THAT THEY MIGHT CONSIDER AN APPROACH WITH THE U.S. SUBMITTING A SIDE LETTER AND THE SOVIETS RESPONDING WITH A SIDE LETTER OF THEIR OWN TAKING A DIFFERENT POSITION. I REJECTED THIS SUGGESTION AS UNACCEPTABLE.

5. KUZIMIN INDICATED AGAIN THAT THEY HAD PROVIDED US WITH SEVERAL FORMULATIONS FOR PRICE C AUSE 6 OF THE OIL LETTER OF INTENT AND URGED THAT WE ACCEPT ONE OF THESE TO RESOLVE THIS ISSUE. OUT OF THIS DISCUSSION EVOLVED THE POSSIBILITY OF A COMPROMISE ALONG THE LINES SUGGESTED REFTEL B, PARA Z. HOWEVER, WE ENDED UP WITH WHAT I BELIEVE TO BE AN IMPROVEMENT OVER SUGGESTED NEW TEXT REFTEL B, PARA 7, BY ADDING TO THE PRESENLY APPROVED TEXT THE EARLIER FORMULATION, ON THIS BASIS IT WOULD NOW READ AS FOLLOWS:

"PRICES FOR CRUDE OIL AND PETROLEUM PRODUCTS WILL BE MUTUALLY AGREED AT A LEVEL WHICH WILL ASSURE THE INTERESTS OF BOTH THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS; SUCH PRICES TO BE ESTABLISHED IN THE CONTRACTS ON THE BASIS OF WORLD PRICES, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT THE QUALITY OF THE CRUDE OIL AND PETROLEUM PRODUCTS SUPPLIED AND TRANSPORTATIN CONDITIONS". I EMPHASIZED THAT ALTHOUGH I WOULD



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SUBMIT THIS ALTERNATIVE TO WASHINGTON I HAD NO AUTHORITY TO ACCEPT IT AS SUBSTITUTE FOR SIDE LETTER.

6. ALTHOUGH KUZIMIN AND GORDEYEV APPEARED TO VIEW THIS AS A SIGNIFICANT CONCESSION ON THEIR PART, IN THE INTERESTS OF RESOLVING THIS ISSUE THEY AGREED TO SEEK APPROVAL OF THIS FORMULATION FROM PATOLICHEV AS SOON AS HE COULD BE CONTACTED AND PROMISED A RESPONSE BY 8:08 P.M. THIS EVENING, MOSCOW TIME. AT 7:30P.M. WE RECEIVED BY TELEPHONE CONFIRMATION OF PATOLICHEVIS ACCEPTANCE OF THIS FORUMULATION.

7. I BELIEVE THAT WE FACE TWO BASIC ALTERNATIVES AS FOLLOWS: A) CONTINUE TO DEMAND A SLIDE LETTER. (IT APPEARS HIGHLY UNKIKELY THAT WE CAN OBTAIN SUCH A LETTER EVEN WITH FURTHER MODIFICATIONS WHICH KUZIMIN SAID HE SAW NO POINT IN DISCUSSING.) B) ACCEPT THE REVISED PRICE CLAUSE 6 OF THE OIL LETTER OF INTENT (PARA 5 ABOVE). (THIS, COMBINED WITH CLAUSE 4 OF THE OIL LETTER

NEITHER HAD SUGGESTIONS FOR WHAT WE MIGHT USEFULLY DO BEYOND COUNSELLING LEBANESE TO STOP FIGHTING AND WORK FOR POLITICAL RECONCILIATION. END SUMMARY

2. PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS WERE CONSIDERABLY MORE EXTENDED THAN THOSE OF KHADDAM. IN COURSE TWO HOUR MEETING ASAD DISCOURSED AT LENGTH ON THEME THAT LEBANESE PROBLEM WAS BASICALLY ONE FOR ARAB NATION TO ASSIST IN SOLVING. LEBANESE CRISIS IS POLITICAL NOT RELIGIOUS I ORIGIN. THE VARIOUS POLITICAL FACTIONS, HE MENTIONED SPECIFICALLY PPS AND PROGRESSIVE SOCIALIST FRONT, CONTAINED REPRESENTA-TIVES OF ALL SECTS, RE OUR IMPRESSION THAT SYRIANS MIGHT FEEL US SUPPORTS HARD LINE CHRISTIAN POSITION, PRESIDENT SAID THIS WAS NOT IN FACT THE VIEW OF ANY RESPONSIBLE

ASSURED HIM THIS WAS MERELY OUR BEST INDEPENDENT JUDGMENT AND REPRESENTED NO US COLLUSION WITH ISRAELIS, HE APPEARED TO ACCEPT THIS. ASAD THEN EMPHASIZED THAT SYRIAN POLICY TOWARDS LEBANON DOES NOT TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION WHAT ISRAEL MAY OR MAY NOT DO. SYRIA WOULD FULFILL ITS DUTY TOWARDS LEBANON NO MATTER WHAT. 5. ASAD ASKED IF HE HAD ANY SPECIFIC IDEAS TO PROPOSE CONCERNING OUR ROLE. I SAID WE HAD NOT; ONE POINT OF THIS MEETING WAS TO ELICIT SYRIAN IDEAS. THIS CLEARLY PLEASED HIM AND HE EXPOUNDED ON THEME THAT SYRIA HAD PURSUED POLICY THROUGHOUT THE RECENT MONTHS OF MAIN-



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TAINING CONTACT WITH ALL FACTIONS. IT REFUSED SUPPORT
THE VIEWS OF ANY SINGLE CLIQUE. I SAID THIS CLEARLY
WAS OUR POSITION AS WELL AND SHOWED THERE WAS INDEED IMPORTANT
COMMON GROUND BETWEEN US. ASAD SAID KHADDAM HAD ATTENDED FIRST

Z. KHADDAM WAS MORE RETICENT THAN ASAD. AFTER LISTENING CAREFULLY, HIS FIRST COMMENT WAS THAT SYRIA MADE NO DISTINCTION BETWEEN MOSLEMS AND CHRISTIANS IN DEALING WITH THE LEBANESE CONFLICT. IT HAD GOOD TIES WITH ALL SIDES; IT WAS CONCERNED WITH AND FOR ALL OF THEM. IT WORKED FOR THE SAFETY AND UNITY OF LEBANON. I SAID THIS WAS, OF COURSE, OUR BASIC AIM AND REFLECTED IN EVERY CON-VERSATION OUR AMBASSADOR IN BEIRUT HAD WITH THE LEBANESE LEADERSHIP. FOR THE SECRETARY FROM EAGLEBURGER

1. AS I TOLD YOU HE WOULD, MR. Z CAME IN TO SEE ME THIS AFTERNOON TO REPORT ON HIS DISCUSSIONS WITH HIS FRIEND. THE HIGHLIGHTS WERE AS FOLLOWS:

(A) THE MOOD OUT THERE IS EXCELLENT AND THE FRIEND EXPRESSED NOTHING BUT THE WARMEST OF FEELINGS FOR YOU. HE APPRECIATED YOUR IPHONE CALL AND "THERE IS NO PROBLEM."

(B) AS TO THE OTHER MATTER, EVERYTHING IS IN TRAIN. FOR THE SECRETARY FROM HARTMAN

THE FOLLOWING IS OUR PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT OF THE GISCARD VISIT TO THE SOVIET UNION AND OF THE COMMUNIQUE SIGNED OCTOBER 17:

2. THE PRINCIPAL NEW ELEMENTS IN THE COMMUNIQUE WERE ONE SUBSTANTIVE POINT (A SOVIET PROPOSAL) - AGREEMENT TO CALL FOR A WORLD DISARMAMENT CONFERENCE IN WHICH ALL NUCLEAR POWERS HOULD PARTICIPATE, BOTH IN THE PREPARATIONS AND IN THE CONFERENCE ITSELF - AND ONE PROCEDURAL ELEMENTSOUGHT BY FRANCE - AGREEMENT TO HOLD PERIODIC FRANCO-SOVIET SUMMIT MEETINGS, BUT WITHOUT SPECIFICATION OF THE PERIODICITY, NOR EVEN OF THE DATE OF BREZHNEV'S RETURN VISIT TO FRANCE.

3. ON CSCE, THE COMMUNIQUE HAD ONLY ANODYNE LANGUAGE ON MUTUAL AGREEMENT TO COOPERATE ON IMPLEMENTATION AND READI-NESS TO CARRY OUT ALL PROVISIONS OF THE FINAL ACT.

4. THE COMMUNIQUE MERELY RECORDED AN EXCHANGE OF VIEWS: ON THE SOVIET PROPOSAL FOR BANNING MANUFACTURE OF ARMS OF MASS DESTRUCTION, AND THAT FUTURE EXCHANGES ON THIS SUBJECT

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WOULD TAKE PLACE.

5. ON NON-PROLIFERATION, THE COMMUNIQUE CALLED ONLY FOR UNILATERAL ASSUMPTION OF APPROPRIATE RESPONSIBILITIES, WITH INCLUSION OF THE FRENCH POINT ABOUT CONSIDERATION FOR LDC'S FOR WHOM "ACCESS TO NUCLEAR TECHNOLOGY CONSTITUTES A KEY TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT."

6. ON THE MIDDLE EAST, THE COMMUNIQUE REITERATED LANGUAGE IN THE MARCH, L975 BILATERAL COMMUNIQUE (WHEN PRIME MINISTER CHIRAC VISITED MOSCOW) CONCERNING THE "LEGITIMATE RIGHTS" OF THE PALESTINIANS, INCLUDING THAT TO A HOMELAND, AS WELL AS MENTION OF ISRAELI WITHDRAWAL FROM ALL OCCUPIED TERRITORIES, SURE AND RECOGNIZED FRONTIERS, ETC.

7. ON CYPRUS, THERE WERE NO NEW ELEMENTS, BUT REPETITION OF CALLS IN PREVIOUS BILATERAL COMMUNIQUES FOR "WITHDRAWAL OF FOREIGN TROOPS", RESPECT FOR THE INDEPENDENCE AND TERRITORIAL INTEGRITY OF CYPRUS, ETC.

8. BREZHNEV AND GISCARD ALSO SIGNED THREE AGREEMENTS ON COOPERATION IN THE FIELDS OF ENERGY, TOURISM, AND CIVIL AVIATION AND AIRCRAFT PRODUCTION (WE HAVE NOT YET RECEIVED THESE TEXTS).

9. FOR GISCARD THE VISIT WAS PROBABLY A DISAPPOINTMENT, MARRED IRRECUPERABLY BY THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING BREZHNEV'S DRAMATIC CURTAILMENT OF THE TALKS. THOUGH BREZHNEV EMPHASIZED TO THE PRESS TODAY THAT THE RESCHEDULING AND SHORTENING WERE DUE TO A BAD COLD HE HAD TAKEN, THERE REMAINS MUCH SPECULATION - PARTICULARLY IN THE FRENCH PRESS - THAT GISCARD RECEIVED PEREMPTORY TREATMENT BECAUSE BREZHNEV HAD FOUND GISCARD'S VIEWS UNCONGENIAL, E.G., THE PART OF GISCARD'S TOAST CALLING FOR EXTENSION OF DETENTE SO AS TO CURB IDEOLOGICAL COMPETITION.

10. AT ANY RATE, IT SEEMS CLEAR THAT THE VISIT DID NOT FULLY SERVE GISCARD'S MAIN PURPOSE - TO PROVE HIMSELF THE WORTHY SUCCESSOR OF DE GAULLE AND POMPIDOU AS A WORLD STATESMAN DEALING WITH BREZHNEV AS A RESPECTED EQUAL. INGERSOLL BT

1. WE THINK YOU MUST SLOW DOWN TIMETABLE AT LEAST AS FAR AS ANNOUNCEMENT IS CONCERNED. THUS, FOR COMPLICATED REASONS INVOLVING PUBLIC RELATIONS, CONSULTATION HERE WITH CONGRESSMEN AND OTHERS, AND CONSIDERATIONS OF EFFECT ON MARKETS, WE PROPOSE PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT BE MADE FROM WHITE HOUSE AT 4:00 P.M. MONDAY, OCTOBER 20 AND SOVIET AGREEMENT NOT TO MAKE ANNOUNCEMENT PRIOR TO 11:00 P.M. MOSCOW TIME OCTOBER 20. ON ASSUMPTION THIS AGREEABLE AND THAT REMAINING POINTS AT ISSUE ARE SATISFACTORILY RE-SOLVED YOU COULD SIGN WHENEVER MUTUALLY CONVENIENT. IN THIS CASE, IF YOU LEFT MOSCOW YOU WOULD MAKE STATEMENT AT AIRPORT THAT YOU HAVE COMPLETED YOUR TALKS AND THAT AN ANNOUNCEMENT WILL BE MADE IN WASHINGTON ; SOON. " WE UNDERSTAND THIS MAY INCONVENIENCE YOU AND REGRET THAT FACT.

WE HAVE SERIOUS PROBLEM WITH YOUR FORMULATION IN PARA-GRAPH THREE REFTEL (A). POINT OF PARAGRAPH STATE IS

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245190 WAS TO AVOID PUTTING PRESIDENT IN POSITION WHERE HE HAD "ASKED" FOR LIMITATIONS. THIS COULD BE SIGNIFI-CANT IN TERMS FARMER REACTION HERE. SINCE YOU NOW HAVE AUTHORITY TO AGREE TO SEVEN MILLION TONS YOU HAVE NEGO-TIATING CARD TO MOVE SOVIETS TO ACQUIESCE IN U.S. STATEMENT THAT SOVIET GOVERNMENT HAS INFORMED US THAT THEIR PURCHASING PLANS FROM THE 1975 CROP DO NOT EN-VISAGE PURCHASING MORE THAN SEVEN MILLION ADDITIONAL TONS OF U.S. GRAIN WITHOUT CONSULTATION.

3. WITH RESPECT OIL LETTER OF INTENT WE COULD ACCEPT SOME OF YOUR PROPOSAL FOR NEW PARAGRAPH SIX IF, AS YOU ANTICIPATE, YOU ARE UNABLE TO DO MUCH BETTER. HE INSIST, HOWEVER, THAT THERE BE NO MENTION OF WORLD PRICES WHICH, IN FACT, DON'T EXIST.

4. THE PHRASE "PRICES ... WILL BE ESTABLISHED IN THE CONTRACTS" ALSO GIVES US PROBLEMS. CONCEPT IS DESIRABLE INSOFAR AS PRIVATE COMPANIES ARE CONCERNED, BUT MEANING FUL DIL AGREEMENT BETWEEN GOVERNMENTS, INCLUDING OPTION FOR U.S. GOVERNMENT TO PURCHASE, SHOULD AT LEAST CONTAIN PRICE FORMULA FOR U.S. GOVERNMENT PURCHASES. AT MINIMUM WE DO NOT WISH TO PRECLUDE THAT POSSIBILITY FROM FUTURE NEGOTIATIONS.

5. THUS, PARAGRAPH SIX OF THE CIL LETTER OF INTENT COULD READ: "PRICES FOR CRUDE OIL AND PETROLEUM PRODUCTS WILL BE MUTUALLY AGREED AT A LEVEL WHICH WILL ASSURE THE INTERESTS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS. SUCH PRICES WILL BE ESTABLISHED, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT THE QUALITY OF THE CRUDE OIL AND PETROLEUM PRODUCTS, SUPPLY AND TRANSPORTATION CONDITIONS, BY AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE PARTIES IN THE CASE OF PURCHASES FOR THE U.S. GOVERNMENT AND IN COMMERCIAL CONTRACTS BETWEEN PRIVATE U.S. FIRMS AND SOVIET FOREIGN TRADE ORGANIZATIONS IN THE CASE OF PURCHASES NOT FOR THE U.S. GOVERNMENT.

6. /TO COMMNCE NEGOTIATIONS PROMPTLY" IS ACCEPTABLE AS REPLACEMENT FOR "WITHIN THIRTY DAYS" WITH ORAL AGREEMENT ON LOCUS AND THAT THIS MEANS THIS MONTH, OCTOBER 1975. INGERSOLL BT

AT THE INVITATION OF SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE, CARL ALBERT, THE SPEAKER OF THE KNESSET, ISRAEL YESHAYAHU, WILL LEAD A DELEGATION OF APPROXIMATELY TEN KNESSET MEMBERS AND STAFF TO THE UNITED STATES. PRELIMINARY PLANS HAVE THE GROUP IN WASHINGTON ON NOVEMBER 10 AND 11. THE CONGRESSIONAL LEADER --SHIP HAS ALREADY PLANNED LUNCHEONS FOR THE GROUP ON CAPITOL HILL FOR THE TWO DAYS THEY WILL BE HERE. MEETINGS AND OTHER ACTIVITIES ARE ALSO BEING PLANNED. BEFORE THE RE-MAINDER OF THE SCHEDULE IS FINALIZED, THE SPEAKER WOULD LIKE TO KNOW WHAT ACTIVITIES WE WOULD LIKE TO PLAN. HE HAS ASKED SPECIFICALLY WHETHER YOU WOULD WANT TO HOST A RECEP-TION FOR THE GROUP WHILE THEY ARE IN WASHINGTON.

2. YOU MIGHT WANT THE DEPARTMENT'S ACTIVITIES TO PARALLEL THOSE OFFERED TO THE EGYPTIAN PARLIAMENTARY DELEGATION WHICH VISITED THE PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT, A MEETING WITH YOU IN YOUR CONFERENCE ROO , AND A LUNCHEON HOSTED BY MR. SISCO.

3. SINCE THE KNESSET DELEGATION WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR LUNCH AND SINCE MR. SISCO WILL BE OUT OF TOWN DURING THIS
